

**Volunteer Role Description:
Preschool and Elementary School Teacher**

Volunteer Title: Preschool and Elementary School Teacher (three preschool grades and grades one and two of Elementary school)

Location: Camino Seguro, Guatemala City, Guatemala.

Start Date: 3rd April 2023

Direct Manager: This role will sit under the English department lead, Sarah de Lemus, the director of preschool, Maria José Revolorio and the director of elementary School, Elizabeth Franke.

Volunteer Purpose: This role has been created for an ESL-trained volunteer who would like to join us for four months (with a possibility to extend and work with the local teacher) to teach our preschoolers, 1st and 2nd graders covering maternity leave. This is an opportunity to lead a class following a curriculum and lesson plans written by the class teacher including reading, writing, grammar and conversation classes. This is an opportunity for you to bring your creativity and ideas and help develop something that will have a lasting impact on the school and community. We will also be recruiting a volunteer teacher aid to support you.

Volunteer Duties and Responsibilities: The following are an idea of the principal responsibilities of the role however, other things may be added as the role develops:

1. Lead ESL classes for preschool grades Parvulos 1, 2 and 3 and elementary grades one and two. In preschool six, 30-minute classes and in elementary, six, 40-minute classes per week.
2. Prepare for your lessons, materials for class and the classroom ready for the students.
3. Follow a curriculum and lead the classes, keeping the lead teacher informed at all times.
4. Work alongside the other preschool and elementary teachers working as a team and involving yourself in school events and activities.
5. Be a role model for the students as they navigate their school time.

Our promise to you: We pledge to provide the following elements to the program to ensure its success:

1. A safe, secure, supportive working environment allowing you to feel accountable for your work whilst supported by the team;
2. Access to our onsite health clinic for any health issues; all contact with the clinic remains confidential;
3. Support from the department head to allow you to complete your task;
4. 24/7 support from our volunteer coordinator onsite and when in your homestay;
5. Support from the director of volunteering onsite;
6. An opportunity to test your skills and knowledge and gain experience and knowledge in a professional work environment;
7. An opportunity to be a role model for the children;
8. An opportunity to make a lasting difference to the community;
9. A place to meet like-minded individuals and make life-long friends;
10. A work reference to take home with you written and signed by the director of volunteering;
11. An opportunity to be awarded the President's Volunteer Service Award (US citizens only) for your hard work and dedication - awarded on completion of contract period.

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Preschool and Elementary School Teacher**

Required Qualifications:

1. A qualification:
 - a. Related to teaching in preschool or elementary.
 - b. Related to teaching English or ESL to young learners (for example TEYL)
- OR
- c. At least two years' experience working in a preschool or elementary classroom with a structured curriculum.
2. Intermediate level Spanish.
3. Willing to commit to a four-month volunteer period working Monday to Friday.

Extra Beneficial Skills:

1. Working knowledge of preschool curriculum, creating it or creating plans from a preschool curriculum.
2. Experience working with expeditionary learning.
3. Experience working in Latin America.

Working Conditions:

You will be working onsite in our preschool with children aged three to six and our elementary school grades one and two, replacing Yeni on her maternity leave. Other preschool and elementary teachers, the director of the school and other staff will all be onsite to support you and there may be a volunteer teacher aid with you as well. The space is small but well planned out with good size classrooms and lots of outdoor space; it's a lovely place to work.

You will be working in Zone 3 of Guatemala City, this is an insecure zone of the city and you will be required to follow strict safety rules that will be explained to you when you start work; these rules are mandatory. This will include rules related to Covid-19 including mask use and social distancing, we follow national law and these rules **must** be adhered to.

Due to the nature of our work, the community is incredibly poor. Working in this environment can take a toll on your mental health, please ensure that you are prepared for this and are willing to talk to Safe Passage about it if you need to. The school and Safe Passage offices have a very high level of cleanliness however, it is based next to a landfill site so the community can be dirty and the air quality is lower than you might be used to.

Guatemala is a truly fascinating country full of history, culture, traditions and places to explore. However, one of the most frustrating things is that safe places to live often come with a long commute to work because they are popular. For that reason, please understand and prepare yourself for traffic problems as we safely bring you to and from work from your host family. On a good day, it will be a two hour round trip, on a bad day it could be three or four hours so please bring things to keep yourself entertained and try on to let it get to you.
